SERIES QUILT 2022

Our 2022 Series Quilts promise to offer everyone some fun. I have chosen two projects which offer you flexibility and creativity as you would choose. If you want to simply follow the instructions or in one project buy a kit, you can. If you want a smaller version of the quilts, both have convenient ways to adjust the size to your liking.

The first project is called Ruby Sensations. This is a medallion quilt, meaning it is worked from the center block out, like a round robin. The quilt size



is 86" X 86", however, you can stop at any point to make it smaller or add additional round to make it bigger. The center block also offers options. The pattern has a Missouri Star in the center, but a Carpenter's Star would also work if it measured the same. The pattern is available through Missouri Star Company, and there are three color wave kits available.

The second project is called Seminole Border Sampler. This quilt plays off the traditional Seminole Quilts and garments that



the Florida Seminole Indians make. Their artwork is all by hand, with very tiny pieces. I have taken the time to increase the size of the Seminole strips to show the unique pieced borders that this beautiful technique to do for your quilts. The instructions for this project will come to you monthly since it is written by me. If you want to audition fabric, look for Light, Medium, and Dark fabrics with high contrast. You can make this in three colors (L/M/D) or scrappy. (I used a jelly roll plus yardage for mine). Instructions for both will be provided in January.

LET'S GET READY FOR THE QUILT SHOW!

The website is now open to everyone for quilt entries. The website works best if using a computer or laptop.

Paper copies of the form will be available for those without computer access. A file with the form has been emailed to you. The file can also be found in the Files section on both HPQG Facebook groups.

You will need to register as a new user the first time you enter a quilt. After that, you will just log in. Have a photo of your quilt as you will need to upload it before entering your data. This is for insurance purposes to

identify your quilt so it doesn't have to be perfect. You can even do this before it's been quilted.

Enter as soon as possible, please! It gives those who are accepting the entries more time to organize rather than a big rush at the end.

Just a reminder that all large quilts need to have a hanging sleeve OR a 5" x 7" piece of fabric sewn at the top back with large letters TOP on it. All small quilts need at least a 2" sleeve to hang on a rod.

All quilts entered for the last quilt show are no longer in the program and have to be re-entered!

QUILT SHOW BOUTIQUE

Please bring in items for the quilt show boutique to the January meeting if you have them. Quilt patterns, magazines and books don't need to be priced, nor do fat quarters. However, please price everything else! In addition to fabric, sewing tools, etc., that you want to donate, consider making a boutique item of some kind: pot holders, tea towels, scrap bags, pin cushions, bags, aprons, Christmas ornaments, etc. -- Marianne Bodine

CUT FABRIC (FOR 16 X 16 BAG):

- Back – 18" x 18"
- Lining (shows through vinyl) – 18" x 18"
- Lining for bottom contrast fabric -- 5½" x 16½"
- Lower Border Fabric -- 4½" x 16½"
- Zipper Strips -- 2 @ 1½" x 16½"
- Lower Border Trim -- 1 @ 1½" x 16½"
- Handle -- 1 @ 4" x 12"
- Zipper Pull -- 1 @ 1" x 12"
- Vinyl -- 9" x 16½"
- Binding -- (2) 2¼" x WOF (or 64" x 2½")
- Soft and Stable or Pellon Flex-Foam Stabilizer -- 18" x 18"
- Fusible Interfacing for Handle -- 2" x 12"
- Zipper -- 18" or longer
