MARCH WORKSHOP

March 16 -- 9-3 Park United Methodist Church Cost is \$5. We will work on a quilt called Monkey Business from the book, Scrap-Basket Surprises by Kim Brackett. The quilt measures 53 x 65. You will need:

25 strips of 2 1/2" x 42" light assorted fabrics for blocks

18 strips of 2 1/2" x 42" dark assorted fabric for blocks

2 yards for outer border and binding 1/2 yard for inner border

Cutting:

Light strips should be cut to 200 rectangles measuring 2 1/2" by 4 1/2" and 4 squares at 2 1/2".

Dark strips should be cut to 144 rectangles measuring 2 1/2" x 4 1/2". Please have these cut and ready for sewing. I did mine in batiks, but you can use any style of fabric you prefer. Longarm Quilters Cindy Heibel Cindy's Nifty Stitches 573-248-4951


2024 Special Ohio Star Block (12 1/2" unfinished)

These directions will make four 4 ½" hourglass blocks. You will need four hourglass blocks per Ohio Star block


Rotary Cutting Instructions:


Materials:

- 2 red (main color 1) 5 1/2" squares
- 2 background (white, cream, reads white or cream) 5 1/2" squares
- Match each main color fabric to a background fabric, right sides together. Draw one diagonal line. Make two sets.



2, Sew ¼" on each side of drawn line. Cut apart on both diagonals, cut the unmarked diagonal first (diagram 2). Do not move your pieces, (3) Cut second diagonal (diagram 3).








You now have four pieces from each square set. With red side up press to set seam then open triangle

piece and GENTLY press to the red fabric. DO NOT PUSH THE IRON AGAINST THE SEAM.

Sort your pieces by color and direction as shown below. Pair up pieces facing in the same direction.



2024 Ohio Star Block (12 1/3" unfinished)

Half Square Triangles (4 ½" unfinished) You will make two sets per Ohio Star Block. Rotary cutting instructions: Materials: 2 background 5" squares (white, light tan, cream)

2 blue (main color 2) squares




1. Place one white 5" square on top of each blue 5" square



a. Draw a diagonal line on one diagonal of each square set.
 b. Sew ¼" on each side of drawn line










3. Cut each block set on drawn diagonal line.



4. Set seams then press seams open or press to the blue. Square the four blocks to 4 1/2"
