

of the quilt making process. Sandra named a couple of people who influenced her quilting journey. First, her great-grandmother who quilted quilts on a treadle sewing machine, and Diane Garman who worked in a quilt shop.

Sandra follows a number of quilting personalities and YouTube channels including, Stitched by Susan, Bold Notions, Lori Holt, Posh Paper Lady, Bethadilly, Jennifer Maker, RBD Designs, Power Tools with Thread, 3 Yard Quilts, Missouri Star Quilt Company, Donna Jordan quilt tutorials, and Natalia Bonner.

Georgia Short lives in Hannibal. She writes, "My interest in sewing came from my grandmother.



Very young, I 'helped' her sew by standing behind the machine and pushing the treadle. From there I took sewing in school. In the late 60's-80's I cross stitched baby quilts for family and friends. I tied them. In the late 80's I started piecing quilts. I took a couple of classes at Sew Fro Sewing Center. I joined HPQG in 94-95. That's where I really learned to quilt. Rosetta Cripe was always ready to help with problems and questions. I held three positions in the Guild--President, Secretary, and Librarian.

I remain a traditional quilter. Eleanor Burns is probably my favorite teacher. I attended several of her workshops. My favorite fabrics are Thimbleberries, Kansas Troubles, and 30's reproduction fabrics. I enjoy all the quilting tools and am sure glad we have them. I also enjoy my family and church."

Sandy Werr lives in Shelbyville, MO and is retired from teaching. She has been quilting for 25 years.
