JULY 19 WORKSHOP SCRAP HAPPY TABLE RUNNER

Beacon United Methodist Church 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Scrap Happy Table Runner is Designed by Jordan Fabrics.

The finished size is 14×55 .

Use your scraps or 15 half jelly rolls or 15 half layer cakes or 25 charm

squares (10 pairs and 5 singles will work best). 1/2 yard background fabric or 5 jelly roll strips or 6 layer cake squares.

Inner sashing uses 1 jelly roll strip or 1 layer cake square.

3/8 yard or 4 jelly roll strips for outside border.

3/8 yard or 4 jelly roll strips for binding.

1 yard backing.

You will be making 5 blocks. They can be matching or scrappy. If you don't want to make a table runner you can make 4 blocks and make it into a square shape.


Members are always welcome to come and work on their own projects.



SUPPLY LIST

Please Bring:

- Pattern for the Tamarack Jacket.
- Sewing machine pins and all of your quilting accessories.
- Quilted jacket fabric, or a quilt you intend to cut up.
- Fabric scissors and paper scissors.
- Fabric for binding, rotary cutter and 6" x 22" ruler and cutting mat. You can cut out your pattern prior to class if you feel comfortable with that.
- Binding clips.

During class I will guide you through cutting out the pattern, making bias binding, attaching the binding and final assembly of the jacket. I am looking forward to meeting all of you!

TAMARACK JACKET CLASS -- WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 6

We're thrilled to announce a Tamarack Jacket sewing class on Wednesday, August 6, from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at the KC Hall in Hannibal. This exciting workshop will be led by the talented Angela Simmons, who will also be speaking at our August 5 meeting. We've attached photos showcasing the beautiful jacket pattern and Angela's comprehensive supply list for your convenience. (see p. 5)

The class will utilize the Grainline Studio Tamarack Jacket pattern (#16002), available in two size ranges (0-18 or 14-32) and easily purchased through Grainlinestudio.com, Amazon, or Etsy. Detailed fabric requirements are included on the back of the pattern. Please note: You do *not* need to pre-quilt your fabric. You'll need fabric for both the outer layer and lining, along with batting, and additional fabric for the bias binding.

Suggested Fabrics

Main and Lining
Fabrics: Light to midweight cottons, linens,
chambrays, and blends
work well for this jacket.
Since the fabric will be
doubled and quilted to
a batting avoid anything
too heavy as the jacket
may become excessively
stiff.

Batting: High quality batting in cotton, wool, bamboo, or a blend. Choose the thickness based on how warm you want your coat to be.

Techniques

Straight seams, basic quilting, inserting welt pockets, and applying bias binding.

Notions

Thread
5 yds of ½" wide
double fold bias
binding (or ½ yd
extra fabric to make
your own)
View A:
4 coat hooks & eyes
View B:
4 heavy duty snaps
Walking Foot

½ Yard (0.5 Meters) extra fabric OR 5 Yards (4.6 Meters) of ½" wide double fold bias binding.

¼ Yard (0.3 Meters) of 22 - 25" (55 - 65 cm) wide fusible interfacing

High quality quilt batting in U.S. Twin size (72" x 80") (183 - 203 cm)
