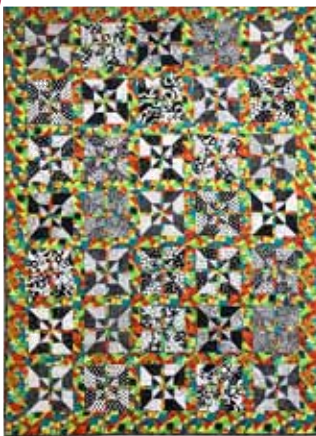

The following day, Wednesday, Sept 4, Tony will be teaching his Divergent Pinwheel quilt pattern. You can follow the supply list for fabric needs based on 2 1/2" strips or use your favorite fabric combinations and cut your own 2 1/2" strips to make the quilt. Two more variations are shown here. Class will begin at 9 a.m. on Wednesday, September 4, at the KC Hall. Cost is \$30. See Linda Belford to register. After August meeting, the class will be opened to non-members if it is not full. Are you working on the December challenge: quilt block that starts with initial of your first name, favorite color, least favorite color. Can be any size.

SUPPLY LIST FOR DIVERGENT PINWHEEL CLASS

- 36 (2 1/2" wide) strips in assorted colors or divide in two colorways;
- 2 1/2 yards coordinating background solid or reads as solid;
- 1/2 yard binding;
- 3 1/2 yards backing
- Twin size quilt batting.
- Optional: quarter inch seam marker

SALT RIVER QUILT SHOW

The Seventh Annual Salt River Quilt Show is coming up soon. It will be held October 5-6 at the Mark Twain Memorial Shrine in Florida, Missouri. This year's theme celebrates 100 Years at Mark Twain State Park and the categories in which quilts can be entered reflect our enjoyment of the outdoors and appreciation of history: "What's the Buzz About?" (wildflowers and their pollinators); "A Walk on the Wild Side" (wildlife past and present); "Into the Woods and Water" (camping, hiking, birding, fishing, boating, swimming – what do you like to do?); "Hints of the Past" (local history remembered – what was here in 1924 and what has changed in the last 100 years?); "Miscellaneous" (anything goes); and "Youth" (ages 18 and under). The quilt entry fee is \$5.00 and you may enter as many as you wish. Quilts will be judged and ribbons and prizes awarded. Entries are due by September 27 and quilts will be hung on October 3. As in prior shows, if you wish to enter any quilts, Marianne Bodine will be glad to pick them up at the guild meetings on either September 3 or October 1, or at the September workshop, and will see that they are returned safely if you cannot pick them on the 6th of October. An entry form can be obtained at Seventh Annual Salt River Quilt Show | Missouri State Parks (mostateparks.com) or ask Marianne for one. Hope to see some of your lovely quilts at the show! Or just come and enjoy the show itself!

Paper Piecing on Foundation Paper

We will be using the 12" Log Cabin. It's a So Emma Quilt Block.

Foundation Paper: You can order your own or let Susan Woodrow know that you would like to have one ordered for you.

You will be using 2 1/2" strip pre-cuts or scraps. You will need to have a ruler that has a 1/4" mark on it, such as an add-a-quarter ruler.

You will need your rotary cutter and mat.

Pat from the Hickory Stick, I went Brick and Mortar on July 1! I am at 320 North Main Street in Hannibal (next to Hickory Stick) so stop by and say Hi! when you're in town. My official grand opening will be Monday, September 8.

My shop is an official drop off and pick up location for "**Project Linus**" and I am also hosting numerous **Girl Scout troops** this fall to get their sewing badge. In talking to the Girl Scout organization, I was made aware that each troop manages its own funds for activities and badge earning abilities and some troops have more funds than others depending on how the girls/leaders do their agendas. In my hosting the girls, I am telling them that no money is required to earn their sewing badge so that all the girls are offered the same opportunity on a level playing field. I plan on the girls making a travel size pillowcase for pillows that I have purchased. So far I have around 48 girls among all the troops signed up. (Coming on different days of course!)
