With Ilene Bartos we will explore a number of ways to enhance your choice of six simple leaf shapes. Techniques include Satin Stitching, Herky-Jerky Quilting,

#### SALT RIVER QUILT SHOW

It's almost time again for the Salt River Quilt Show. It's coming up a little quicker this year, on the weekend of September 16 and 17. Entries will be due the 8th of September, and guilts will be hung on September 14 and judged on the 15th. As in prior shows, Marianne Bodine will be glad to pick quilts up at the guild meeting on September 5 if you wish to enter any, and will see that they are returned safely if you cannot pick them up on the 17th. An entry form can be obtained by going to the following website: Sixth Annual Salt River Quilt Show Missouri State Parks (mostateparks. com). The theme of the show and primary quilt category is "Seasons of Our Lives," in the sense of the stages in life we go through from childhood to adulthood, our careers, our families, our travels, our major life events. Other categories this year are "Hand-Pieced or Hand-Quilted", "Other Quilted Items" (clothing, purses or bags, Christmas tree skirts, table or bed runners, etc.), "Small Quilts (baby quilts, miniatures, small wall-hangings, doll quilts, etc.), and, as always, "Miscellaneous Quilts" for those that don't fit elsewhere.
