Those of you who have ordered a kit will be making

the Cell Mate Crossbody Bag. Remember that we will begin with sewing, so make sure your fabric is cut and fused so you'll be ready to begin sewing and get finished by the end of the day. Also a reminder that this bag is designed for either faux leather, vinyl (not clear vinyl) or cork; it is not designed to be made entirely out of fabric.

If you would like to make this bag but did not order a kit, you will need to bring your own hardware, zippers, webbing, etc. I can make arrangements for the pattern at a cost of \$11. Instructions are also attached to this email. Questions -- contact Linda Belford.

You are also welcome to work on any project on your own during the day. Everyone is welcome!

HPQG Quilt Along 2025

ASSIGNMENT: Make the September block (Pages 21-23) AND make six 4-patch blocks OR Make six cornerstones if making the 6" blocks. See ★ below.

★ It is time to think about how you would like to finish your quilt. Sherri (the author) used 4 patches along with sashing in her 12" block quilt (instructions on pages 32 & 33 and she used cornerstones along with sashing for her 6" block quilt (instructions on page 31).
