

# SUPPLY LIST FOR WORKSHOP OCTOBER 28, 2023

- 2 coordinating or complementary fat quarters for weaving (fabrics A and B)
- 1 fat quarter for backing
- 1/4 yard for binding
- 1 yd paperbacked fusible at least 17" wide (I do not recommend Steam-A-Seam for this project)
- 24" x 24" piece of batting
- Optional embellishments—fussy cut applique motifs or fabric that can be used for that purpose, decorative threads (Sharon will have a variety for participant use)
- Basic sewing supplies including marking pencil, sewing machine, pins, rotary cutter and mat (16" x 24"), 18"or 24" ruler, iron and surface for ironing (the larger wool pressing mat works well)

(You will need batting and backing to work on this project.)
