Make a quilt block of your choice in size and color using a maple leaf block and bring to the November meeting. Use a pattern you already have or look for one online. It will be interesting to see what everyone comes up with!

December 2020 Challenge

Must include words on front of quilt.

Pull fabric from your stash or a friend's stash that has words on it. Suggestions – Note to self, conversation hearts, music lyrics, sayings, sewing quotes, kitchen quotes or recipes just to name a few.

Quilt may be started before 2019 but must be FINISHED in 2020.

Quilt may be any size and must be 2-3 layers. No bags or clothing please. Quilt must include some piecing and quilting. Piecing/quilting may be any technique. Finished Edge does not have to be bound traditionally. Embellishments are optional.

Quilt back must include a hanging sleeve and label made according to the guidelines of the HPQG quilt show rules. On a 3' x 5' index card please tell us what inspired you to make this quilt. Did your fabric come from a friend's stash? Does your quilt have a special story? Tell us if you tried a new technique or used any special techniques? Entries should be kept secret. Please cover up your label with a piece of paper or fabric before handing it in to the program committee at the meeting.

Due Date: Finished challenges are due at our December 2020 meeting.
